Kelly Salvage Operations Leap

Aircraft parts salvage operations at Kelly Air Force Base have grown into a multi-million dollar business, Maj. Gen. Clements McMullen, commanding general, has revealed.

He said \$5,000,000 worth of parts from one aircraft engine project alone were reclaimed and returned to stock in recent weeks. Routine salvage operations accounted for another \$295,105.94 in January.

This project, started last August, included the "cannibalizing" of 430 outmoded R-3350 aircraft engines in storage here, so that Oklahoma City, specializing in this type of engine, could have the parts for urgent modification work.
