Boarding House Fire
Kills Shawano Man
SHAWANO—AT—The body of John Maycel, 52, was found in a second floor bathroom of a boarding house Sunday after a fire swept through the building.

Firemen said Maycel, who had run upstairs when the fire was discovered at the rear of the house, apparently died of suffocation. All other occupants escaped without injury. Preliminary estimates placed damage to the structure at \$10,000.
