'Mozart City' Preparing for Festival

SALZBURG — (ONA)— This historic, picturesque musical shrine city is preparing for another season as host to thousands of tourists who are drawn to the area each summer by three main attractions.

Its colorful appearance and richness of historical associations in themselves would make Salzburg a natural drawing card for travelers. In addition, it serves as a take-off point for the nearby Salzammergut, Austria's charming and gently-rolling lake country, and, most important, it is the site of the world famous Salzburg Festival.

The composer Mozart was born in Salzburg and the festival was originally conceived in his honor.

However, the festival is not exclusively musical. In fact, it was a Max Reinhardt production of the morality play "Everyman" in Salzburg's Cathedral square in 1920 which may be regarded as the first festival. "Everyman" has been a standard item of Salzburg Festival programs ever since, and is still performed in the uniquely appropriate setting of the square facing the cathedral.

Eventually, the festival was expanded to its present extent, which comprises a full month's program of operas, plays, orchestral concerts, ballets, solo recitals and concerts of chamber and sacred music, with two or three performances on some days.

A special theater, the Festival House, has been built to house the grander productions, and an open air arena with the odd name of the Rocky Riding School was established in Hellbrunn Park, near the city.

The festival this year will take place from July 26 to August 31. Operas to be presented will include three of Mozart's, "Così fan tutte," "Don Giovanni," and "The Marriage of Figaro," as well as Richard Strauss' "Der Rosenkavalier" and the world premiere of "The Trial" by Gottfried Einem.

In addition to the perennial "Everyman" there will be one other straight drama, Shakespeare's "Julius Caesar." Eight concerts will be given by the Vienna Philharmonic orchestra under the baton of such conductors as Wilhelm Furtwaengler and Bruno Walter. The ballet of the National Opera of Paris will give two performances. Soloists scheduled are Yehudi Menuhin and Wilhelm Backhaus.
