

COUPLE AWARDED \$3,155 DAMAGES

A Bridgeport man and his wife were granted total damages of \$3,155 yesterday by a Superior court jury for injuries received more than three years ago when an auto in which they were riding in Seaside Park was struck in the rear by a car operated by a student driver.

The jury of six before Judge John H. Kimmer awarded John E. and Myrna Kimmer \$1,625 and \$1,530, respectively, against Melmer Haskim and his son, Al, both of Bridgeport.

Mr. and Mrs. Kimmer claimed they received head, neck and back injuries at 7:15 p. m. July 25, 1951, when their auto, operated by Mr. Kimmer, was struck in the rear by a car driven by Al Haskim under instructions from his father, owner of the vehicle. The accident took place on Barnum dyke, according to the complaint.

Mr. Kimmer claimed damages of \$10,000, and his wife sought \$12,000. They were represented by Herman and Koenig, Realty and Rent, who were counseled for Melmer and Al Haskim. The plaintiffs were married subsequent to the accident.

Here's a Test Of Your Ingenuity

Put yourself in the West seat in today's hand, defending against the contract of five clubs. We'll start you off well by opening that king of hearts for you. You are now on your own.

East plays the ten of hearts on the first trick, and your king holds. This doesn't surprise you, to be sure, and you continue with the ace of hearts on the correct assumption that East's ten of hearts was meant to get you to continue the suit.

The ace of hearts wins likewise, and East completes his signal by dropping the deuce of hearts on the second trick. What next?

Lead another heart. East has asked you to come on, and you have no reason to disobey instructions. You lead your last heart, and South ruffs. South now leads the eight of spades, and it is your play. What do you do?

You play the three of spades, naturally. You're probably wondering when you're going to be required to do something brilliant, but the time hasn't yet come. Dummy wins with the ace of spades, and your partner plays the six of spades.

Dummy leads the five of clubs. Your partner plays the three, and declarer finesses the jack. It is once more your play. What do you do?

You play the four of clubs, naturally. You are still wondering when the brilliant play is going to come along. You are now a dead duck, for you have missed your opportunity.

If South is a good guesser he will now lay down the ace of clubs, hoping that the king will drop. The odds are with him, for East has bid hearts and is likely to be short in clubs. When the king of clubs drops, South can draw the last trump with dummy's queen and claim the rest of the tricks with high diamonds and the king of spades.

When South finesses the jack of clubs you must quickly and naturally drop your middle card, whatever that card happens to be. You must give South some reason to believe that your ten of clubs is now blank. When South sees the eight of clubs fall, in this case, he may well believe that your original holding was the doubton 10-8.

Declarer will then enter dummy with the ten of diamonds to lead, the queen of clubs. The king and ace of clubs will fall on this trick, but your ten won't fall—much to South's disappointment. That ten of clubs will provide the setting trick.

Card Sense

Q—The bidding has been:
North East South West
1 Club Pass 1 Diamond Pass
1 Heart Pass ?
You, South, hold: Spades Q-J-2. Hearts 7-2. Diamonds K-J-9-6. Clubs Q-3. What do you bid?
A—Bid one no-trump. You have good support for clubs, but you prefer to bid or a no-trump in order to hint at a stopper in the unbid suit. You don't guarantee such a stopper, but a failure to bid no-trump would indicate that you didn't have the stopper.

TODAY'S QUESTION
The bidding is the same as in the question just answered. You South, hold: Spades J-7-2. Hearts Q-5-4. Diamonds Q-9-8-3. Clubs A-3. What would you do?
Answer: No-trump.
