

Crosby Lines Up Favorites For Regular Thursday Hour

Marie Ouspenskaya, Jackie Cooper And Kidoodlers
To Aid And Abet Bing And
Bob

The Music Hall debut of Marie Ouspenskaya, well-known character-actress of stage and screen will occupy the attention of Bing Crosby and Bob Burns on Thursday, when they've also invited Jackie Cooper and the Kidoodlers, novelty instrument quartet to be present for the roll call.

The Music Maids and John Scott Trotter's orchestra fill the bill for the broadcast over WEAf at 10 p. m.

Bing sings "Ciribiribin," "After All," "Lilacs in the Rain," "South of the Border," and for his 1926 memory song, "Looking at the World Thru Rose Colored Glasses." John Scott Trotter trots out his famous arrangement of Ravel's "Bolero" for an orchestral interlude.

Walter Huston will be welcomed back to Good News of 1940 to perform the lead in a one-act dramatic sketch, and Lou Holtz will again be on hand with more zany chatter, Thursday, at 9 p. m., over WEAf.

Edward Arnold, master-of-ceremonies, will also introduce the regular Good News stars, including Fanny Brice and Hanley Stafford as Baby Snooks and Daddy, songstress Connie Boswell, Warren Hull and Meredith Willson's orchestra.

The guest appearance of Miss Ruth Doyle, a New Yorker who drives a ten-ton truck for a living . . . and the story of a poet who correctly foretold the tragic fate of six friends, will be featured Thursday at 8:30 p. m., over WABC.

The poet-prophet, Jacques Gazotte, at a dinner party given shortly before the French Revolution, predicted the tragic manner in which each guest would meet his death. Oddly enough, the poet refused to reveal his own fate, altho he claimed that he could foresee it.

Alois Havilla, master-of-ceremonies, will present the story of a horse thief who met justice in 1892, thanks to a strange intervention now regarded as commonplace.
