

Bill Powell And Myrna Loy On Screen Guild Broadcast

**"Mr. And Mrs. Thin Man" Of Movie Fame Will
Co-Star In Comedy, "Single Crossing"
Sunday Night**

William Powell and Myrna Loy, "Mr. and Mrs. Thin Man" of movie fame, will co-star in the comedy, "Single Crossing," on the "Screen Guild Theatre," Sunday, over WABC at 7:30 p. m.

Taken from an original story by John McClain, who has written several of Powell's screen vehicles, the story concerns a young advertising man who hopes to merge his interests with the successful firm of Williams, Wharton, Hooten and Hatton. In order to cinch the deal, Powell must act as guardian and guide for Williams' niece, who is making a trip to Bermuda on the same boat with Powell.

Charlie McCarthy will have someone nearer his own age as object of his amours when Gloria Jean, 12-year-old singing sensation of the screen, is guest of the program Sunday at 8:00 p. m., over WEAf.

While Charlie reaffirms his affection for Gloria, Edgar Bergen will entertain Walter Catlett, veteran character actor who entered the motion picture field after 30 years on the stage. As a grand finale, Charlie produces another dramatic opus, with leading roles divided among Gloria, Catlett and himself, and Bergen in a minor role. Donald Dickson, baritone, and the orchestra conducted by Robert Armbruster, will complete the program.

"What goes up must come down—but hard," episode two of Jack Benny's account of his adventures at Yosemite park, will be presented during his broadcast with Mary Livingstone, Phil Harris, Dennis Day, Don Wilson and Rochester over WEAf Sunday at 7:00 p. m.
