

Juvenile Screen Stars To Frolic On Benefit Program

Mickey Rooney And Judy Garland To Help With Presence In Children's Crusade For Children

Mickey Rooney, Judy Garland, and a group of juvenile screen stars will frolic with Edward G. Robinson as master of ceremonies in "Hollywood Pennies," on Saturday at 9 p. m. over WEAF. This program is part of the Children's Crusade for Children Campaign to have each child in the country contribute a sum in pennies in accordance with his age for the benefit of child refugees.

Col. Roscoe Turner will tell the story of Ray Ott and Danny Gleeson, two American pilots, who were kidnaped by a Mongolian war lord while flying transport planes for the Chinese-American air line, on Sky Blazers, Saturday at 7:30 p. m. over WABC.

Ott and Gleeson were captured in 1930 by General Si Yun, sinister Mongolian bandit chieftain who was plundering the up-country provinces. He needed pilots to teach his men to fly in order that he might rain bombs on Chinese cities that did not pay tribute. How Ott and Gleeson contrived to escape and to bring about the downfall of the war lord forms an exciting climax to the adventure.

How two silver dollars actually cost the lives of a police officer and a pair of gun-crazy North Dakota killers will be told on Gang Busters when the career of Clarence and Orelle Easton is reviewed by Col. H. Norman Schwarzkopf and an officer connected with the case Saturday at 8 p. m. over WABC.

During a police chase in Illinois, the Eastons amazed law enforcement officers, who were following in an armor-plated car, by shattering supposedly bullet-proof glass. This they did by hitting the same spot on the windshield with four bullets in succession.

The capture of the gunmen, later in the chase, will provide a thrilling climax for the Gang Busters dramatization.
