

Stokowski Features Negro's Choral Work In Final Concert

Rita Hayworth To Join Bob Hope In Program For Boys In Air Corps; Fibber And Molly Start Eighth Year

Making his final appearance of the season with the Symphony Orchestra, Leopold Stokowski will perform William Grant Still's great choral work, "And They Lynched Him On A Tree," as the highlight of the concert to be broadcast over WJZ on Tuesday, from 9:30 to 10:30 p. m.

Still, one of the foremost Negro composers in the United States, based his music on a poem by Katherine Garrison Chapin, who in private life, is Mrs. Francis Biddle, wife of the United States Attorney General.
