

Edward Arnold Heads Cast For Cavalcade Show Monday

Distinguished Stage And Screen Actor Has Title Role In "Theodore Roosevelt, Man Of Action"

Edward Arnold, distinguished stage and screen star over a long period of years, will play a return engagement on "Cavalcade of America" Monday, in the title role of "Theodore Roosevelt, Man of Action," an exciting drama of a strenuous career, at 8:00 p. m. over WEAJ.

Three Presidents of the United States figure in the action: McKinley, Roosevelt and Wilson. Bill Pringle plays McKinley with Dwight Weist as Wilson.

Missess of the most difficult part of being an outstanding singer—that of having an innate control of proper vocal phrasing—is Joan Brooks, "The Lady from the Blue," who starts her second new half-hour show this month over WJZ on Monday, at 9 p. m. She will be accompanied by Joe Kines and his orchestra.

Johann Strauss waltzes take top billing Monday when Margaret Speaks sings the Viennese composer's "Tales from the Vienna

Woods," and the Firestone Symphony plays his "Village Swallows," at 8:30 p. m., over WEAJ.

Miss Speaks also sings Kreisler's "Stars in My Eyes," "Gavotte" by Popper and Crist's "Some Day, Some Way," and the orchestra completes the concert with Moszkowski's "Mahnwaga" and the "Aragouaise" from Massenet's "Le Cid." Alfred Wallenstein conducts.

John Charles Thomas makes his second visit to the Great Artists Series Monday with Donald Voorhes and the Bell Symphonic Orchestra at 9:00 p. m. over WEAJ.

Jerome Kern's romantic "The Touch of Your Hand," which he wrote for "Roberta," will be the principal number on the program Monday at 10:00 p. m. over WEAJ. It will be sung by Josephine Antoine, golden-voiced girl from the Golden West. Miss Antoine, a native of Boulder, Colo., has been signed with three opera companies (Metropolitan, Chicago and San Francisco) for the fall season.

William Miller, tenor, will sing "Can't You Hear Me Calling, Caroline?" and "I Left My Heart at the Stage Door Canteen." Reinhold Schmidt, bass, will sing "Mary Is a Grand Old Name" as part of a George M. Cohan Medley.
