

# Baby Snooks Will Exploit New Higgins Twins Thursday

Laugh-Provoking Program Starts Its Sixth Year On  
Airwaves, Featuring Fanny Brice  
And "Daddy"

One of radio's top-ranking laugh shows, featuring Fanny Brice as Baby Snooks, Hanley (Daddy) Stafford, Frank Morgan and John Conte, begins its sixth season on the air with the broadcast of Thursday at 8 p. m.

Originally known as "Good News" and presenting some of the biggest names in the entertainment world, the program has enjoyed its greatest success in the last two seasons with the Snooks-Daddy-Morgan combination.

Heard each week by nearly 20 million people, Baby Snooks, tireless questioner and purveyor of mischief, undoubtedly will exploit the new Higgins twins as she sets out to stretch Daddy's elastic patience to the breaking point, and "Fabulous" Frank Morgan, scientist, explorer and authority on countless subjects, will do his utmost to convince "Jockey"

As usual, the chiffton rhythms of maestro Meredith Willson and his orchestra will provide the musical background for "Coffee-Time" and Harlow Wilcox will handle the announcing.

She will main tain that women must fill two assignments today—taking care of her family and home and holding down a war job at the same time. Mother of four children, she works for the OWI in New York.

Orson Welles, back from his South American trip, will make one of his rare radio appearances on the Stage Door Canteen at 9:30 p. m. over WABC. James Melton will sing, accompanied by Raymond Paige's orchestra. Bert Lytell will be heard in his usual role of "Officer of the Day."
