

Baby Snooks Will Exploit New Higgins Twins Thursday

Laugh-Provoking Program Starts Its Sixth Year On Airwaves, Featuring Fanny Brice And "Daddy"

One of radio's top-ranking laugh shows, featuring Fanny Brice as Baby Snooks, Hanley (Daddy) Stafford, Frank Morgan and John Conte, begins its sixth season on the air with the broadcast of Thursday at 8 p. m.

Originally known as "Good News" and presenting some of the biggest names in the entertainment world, the program has enjoyed its greatest success in the last two seasons with the Snooks-Daddy-Morgan combination.

Mother of four children, she works for the OWI in New York.

Orson Welles, back from his South American trip, will make one of his rare radio appearances on the Stage Door Canteen at 9:30 p. m. over WABC. James Melton will sing, accompanied by Raymond Paige's orchestra. Bert Lytell will be heard in his usual role of "Officer of the Day."
