## SCRAP CAMPAIGN WILL CONTINUE FOR SIX WEEKS

ADA, Nov. 20.—A scrap drive  
which started off with expecta-  
tions of obtaining a ton or two  
has resulted in the collection of  
some 22 tons of metal and rub-  
ber here, Paul Hagerman, chair-  
man in charge of the local drive,  
announced Friday. It has contin-  
ued about six weeks.

Included in the total collection  
about a ton of precious met-  
als, he said. This type of metal  
now is being accepted at special  
boxes, which have been placed in  
the two Ada banks.

Among unusual articles do-  
nated is an old canteen, carried  
by a relative of Mrs. Fred Mc-  
Laughlin of Ada. He was a gold  
miner in Arizona.

Due to the fact that many  
farmers now are completing the  
large part of their fall work, they  
are finding time to gather up  
scrap on their farms and bring it  
in to donate. For this reason,  
Hagerman said, the drive will be  
continued for about six weeks in  
Ada.
