CONSERVATION IS KEYNOTE OF ARMY CENTER

LAKE PLACID CLUB, N. Y., Feb. 10 — (UP) — Falling in step with a Second Service Command directive designating November as "Conservation Month," the Army Ground and Service Forces Redistribution Station here went on record as "determined to effect the greatest possible saving in every phase of operation."
