MOTOR COMPANY HAS OKAY TO BUY AUTO

DETROIT, Feb. 24—(UP)—The Ford Motor Co., which has built 30,000,000 autos and trucks, today has permission to buy a new car for its own use—if it can find a Ford dealer who will sell a car at full retail price.

The War Production Board granted a priority yesterday, and the priority must be used at a retail dealer's. The company said it believed it would buy either a Ford, a Lincoln or a Mercury.
