

Helen Hayes To Broadcast 'Romeo and Juliet' Saturday

Helen Hayes will be heard with the famous Shakespearean actor, Maurice Evans, in "Romeo and Juliet," when it is presented as the closing dramatic show for the radio theatre series at 7 p. m. Saturday over CBS.

It was in the role of "Romeo" that Evans made his first New York appearance in 1935. He had just arrived from London where he had won outstanding dramatic laurels for his Shakespearean roles. He is now on Broadway in "Hamlet."
