Plan Launched to Curb Eels

States Hope to Reduce Parasite from Lakes

The lamprey eel, enemy of choice Great Lakes food fishes, will be the target of a campaign to be started soon by the states bordering on the Great Lakes and by the province of Ontario.

Dr. Edward Scheneberger, superintendent of fish management for the Wisconsin conservation department, was this state's representative at a conservation conference recently at Ann Arbor, Mich. Attending the gathering were delegates from the lakes states and the U. S. fish and wildlife service.

Campaign Planned

As a result of that gathering, the campaign against the parasite lamprey eels will begin soon, with each of the participating agencies assigned to a definite portion of the drive.

A survey of lamprey spawning streams by all Great Lakes states and Ontario will be made to determine the location and size of the spawning runs, and various phases of the lamprey life history will be investigated to discover "vulnerable stages" subject to control measures.

Experiments, with weirs, traps, and other devices which can be used to destroy lampreys will be carried on, and a survey will be made of the extent of lamprey attacks and their effect on the marketability and abundance of Great Lakes fish, especially trout.

Studied as Food

Researchers also will study the eels as a possible source of food and vitamins. If the parasites are found valuable for either purpose, the revenue could be used for control work.

Experts on the subject contend that it would be impossible to eradicate the lamprey eel, but they hope that reduction in numbers of the parasite will be worthwhile.

Sportsmen's clubs, 4-H groups, Boy Scouts, and other organizations will be enlisted in the campaign, so that accurate information on spawning runs can be obtained and so that specimens needed for identification can be secured.
