Plan Launched to Curb Eels

States Hope to Reduce Parasite from Lakes lamprey y eel, enemy of Lakes food fishes,

choice choice Great Lakes 1000 IISHES, will be the target of a campaign to be started soon by the states bordering on the Great Lakes and by the province of Ontario. Dr. Edward Scheneberger, su-perintendent of fish management the Wisconsin

conservation de-

partment, was this state's repre-partment, was this state's repre-sentative at a conservation con-ference recently at Ann Arbor, Mich. Attending the gathering were delegates from the lakes states and the U. S. fish and wild-life sawring. life service. Campaign Planned
As a result of that gathering, the campaign against the parasitic lamprey eels will begin soon, with each of the participating agencies assigned to a definite portion of the drive.

the drive. A survey of lamprey spawning streams by all Great Lakes states and Ontario will be made to determine the location and size of the spawning runs, and various phases of the lamprey life history will be investigated to discover "vulnerable stages" subject to control measures.

control measures. Experiments, with weirs, traps, and other devices which can be used to destroy lampreys will be carried on, and a survey will or made of the extent of lamprey attacks and their effect on the marketability and abundance of Great Lakes fish especially trout

Studied as Food

Lakes fish, especially trout.

Researchers also will study the eels as a possible source of food and vitamins. If the parasites are found valuable for either purpose, the revenue could be used for control work. the subject contend Experts on that it would be impossible to eradicate the lamprey eel, but they hope that reduction in numbers of the parasite will be worth-

while. Sportsmen's clubs, 4-H groupe, Boy Scouts, and other organizations will be enlisted in the campaign, so that accurate information on spawning runs can be obtained and so that specimens needed for identification can be secured.
