## 41 New Polio Cases Reported in State

Forty-one new cases of polio boosted the state's total to 436 cases this weekend, the state health board announced Monday.

Twelve of the new cases were reported from Milwaukee. Ashland was the next hardest hit with four victims, while Oshkosh and Wisconsin Rapids had two each.

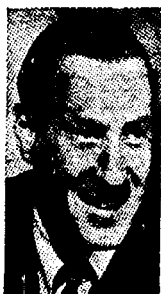
