JAMES STEWART WILL BE THE STAR OF NBC'S "Screen Directors' Playhouse" Friday, when the program presents an adaptation of "Call Northside 777." The semi-documentary locale film, released last year, was based on the true story of a Chicagoan charged in 1932 with the murder of a policeman and sentenced to 99 years in Stateville Penitentiary. He was cleared almost 13 years later through the efforts of his mother and a reporter for the Chicago Times. Stewart's role is that of the reporter. Henry Hathaway, who directed the film, will be commentator for the radio adaptation. Hathaway also has directed several other documentary-type films, including "The House on 92nd Street," "13 Rue Madeleine" and "Kiss of Death." WOAI—9 P.M.
