## Salon Deadline Near, State Artists Warned

Only five days remain for Wisconsin artists to submit entry cards for the 16th annual Wisconsin Salon of Art, the leading fall art competition in the state, the University of Wisconsin announced Wednesday.

Entry blanks may be obtained from the Wisconsin Union Gallery committee. The exhibition will be hung in two galleries in the Memorial Union from Nov. 16 to Dec. 10.

Deadline for submitting entry cards is Nov. 1, and art works must reach the Union by Nov. 9. Entries will be judged on Nov. 11 and 12 and awards will be presented Wednesday night, Nov. 15, at the formal opening of the exhibition.
