City Man Jailed for Non-Support

Joseph Bong, 22, of 1520 Packers ave., was sent to jail by Circuit Judge Herman W. Sachtjen late Wednesday afternoon for 90 days for failing to pay \$15 per week for support of his two children.

Bong's wife, Elizabeth, has filed suit for divorce and Bong was ordered by a court commissioner to pay \$15 a week to her for support of their two children.

County Divorce Counsel Sverre O. Brathen said Bong has failed to make a payment for the past month. Judge Sachtjen ordered Bong to be released from jail during the daytime under the Huber law to work, and to pay his wife from his earnings.
